### Dress Code Reminder

## Get to Know Valley Academy Teachers

All our teachers' profiles are available in the front office for your review.

### And now, a word from our Government ...

As a public school, Valley Academy is asked to make our families aware of certain state and governmental notices. Here they are, in a nutshell:

**AZ HB2732**-stipulates that 3rd grade students who obtain a score on the reading portion of the AIMS test that demonstrates the pupil is reading far below the third grade level may not be promoted from the third grade.

**Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)** - Parents are allowed to inspect school records and have an expectation of privacy in educational matters. For more information on FERPA rights, check out the *Academics/Curriculum/Special Education* area of our website, or ask the school office for assistance.

**IRS Form 990** - A copy of the school's non-profit tax return is available in the school office upon request.

**Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA)** - The school has been inspected for asbestos and certified to be asbestos free. The required AHERA Management Plan and inspection materials are available in the school office.

**Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)** - Students with disabilities are entitled to a copy of procedural safeguards. For more information, check out the *Academics/Curriculum/Special Education* section of Valley Academy's website, or ask the school office for assistance.

**McKinney-Vento Act** - Special guidelines on the enrollment and education of homeless children are outlined in the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act. For more information, see [www.ed.gov](http://www.ed.gov).



## Stay Safe this School Year!

Some things to keep in mind as we start off the new school year:

### 3:15 Pick Up Areas

If your child knows that you are walking up to pick them up, then he or she should be standing in quiet lines inside the music room. Please do not pick your child up from the classroom. It adds extra bodies in the halls and delays the proper process. In addition, parents should always have their name badges on while on campus.

If you are driving up, then your child/ren will be in the M.P.R. Please leave your name placard on the dashboard until your child is in your car. The teachers on duty in the colored zones also need to see them. This speeds up the process of dismissal. Also, please keep in mind that when your child gets into your car that others are waiting to pull up. Please carry on conversations after you have pulled away from the pickup zones. We are trying to make this a safe but speedy process in order to get everyone safely on their way as soon as possible.

**Early Drop Off** In an effort to minimize traffic congestion on and off campus in the morning, Valley Academy offers **free** early drop off at 7:30 a.m. Please drop your child off on the east side of campus so that they may enter the M.P.R. where Valley Academy staff will supervise them until our teachers are on morning duty and they may enter the playground areas. We are providing free student supervision on campus at 7:30 a.m. in order to widen the window of our free drop off time. We hope that you will take advantage of the extra time and bring your children all the way around to the east side for drop off. Remember that the drop off area on the west side of campus is to be used only by families of kindergarten students; all others are to be dropped off on the east side behind the M.P.R. Please be respectful and mind the school's traffic procedures. If earlier drop off is needed, the Coyote Club is open as early as 6:30 a.m. Coyote Club fees will apply from 6:30 a.m. - 7:30 a.m. Please just leave 5-10 minutes earlier each morning in order to keep our students safe and out of harm's way! We really appreciate the parents who have made the effort to follow the school's rules. Together, we can improve the efficiency and safety on campus!

**Late Pick Up** 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students who are not picked up by 2:30 p.m. will be registered into Academic Arcade and parents will be billed monthly. Students who are not picked up by the end of the 3:15 p.m. dismissal process will be registered into Coyote Club and billed accordingly. Preschool students **must** be picked up promptly at dismissal time. Students who are not picked up will be escorted to the office and parents will be called.

**Early Pick Up** Parents, please remember that the end of the academic day is just as important as the beginning. Please refrain from pulling your children out of school early. It is distracting to the whole class, and your child is missing necessary academic time.



**Chess Club** -We are looking for adults willing to host the Chess Club on Thursdays each week. We have two teachers willing to share their classrooms for the club. We will have two clubs, one for grades 2-5 and one for grades 6-8. Please contact Mrs. Sommerfield in the office if you are interested.

**Chorus**-Do you like to sing? Come join chorus on Mondays after school until 4:15 p.m. We have fun singing and performing around town. Chorus starts on September 10th and has a once a year after-school fee of \$40.00. Come check us out.

Students will pick up a club extracurricular activities form and will need to pay the club fee before Science Club officially starts on September 13th.
