Do you have friends or family whose kids could benefit from the great education your child is getting? Would your children like to have their neighborhood friends at school with them? Would <u>you</u> like <u>your</u> friends to join the fun, working alongside you on the Valley Academy Parent Organization (VAPO)? Help us build the Valley Academy family by inviting your friends to join you here.



Open Enrollment is November 4th-17th for KG-8th grade. That's the best time for new students to apply. If you have a kindergartener for next year, siblings receive admissions preference, but we need to have an application so we know to save their seat. If you have other children in any grade you'd like to enroll at Valley Academy, please apply during Open Enrollment.



Kindergarteners should be five years old on August 31, 2025, to attend during the 2025-2026 school year. Note that kindergarteners who turn five years old between August 31st and December 31st, 2025 can now attend after passing an assessment that confirms they are ready for kindergarten. After November 17th, any remaining openings are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis, so encourage your friends to apply soon.

The Preschool Waiting List opens at 7:30 a.m. on November 4th, for children who will be four years old by August 31st. Preschool is a private, tuition-based program. Spaces are offered in the order applications are received, with a limited number of half-day positions.


TO BENEFIT CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE

GRADE LEVEL NEWS

See what's happening in 1st grade!

Recently in first grade, we have been diving into the fascinating world of plants! Students have been learning about the different parts of a plant, how water travels from the roots all the way up to the leaves, and how leaves produce food for the plant.

We explored the essential components of a plant: the roots, stem, leaves, and flowers. They've learned that each part has a unique role in keeping the plant healthy and thriving. The roots anchor the plant in the ground and absorb water and nutrients from the soil. The stem serves as a support system, transporting water and nutrients to the leaves and flowers. Lastly, the leaves use the sun to create food to keep the plant healthy and strong.

To see this process in action, we placed celery stalks in a glass of colored water. Over the next few days, the students watched in amazement as the stalk and the leaves at the top of the celery changed color, illustrating how the water moved through the plant's stem.

They also planted and tended to plants. They worked to tend the soil, care for the plant, water it, and make sure it gets plenty of sunlight to grow healthy and strong.

In addition to the experiments, students have been creating colorful plant diagrams. Using construction paper and art supplies, they labeled each part of the plant and decorated their projects with drawings of their favorite flowers and vegetables.

As the month progresses, first graders will continue to explore the importance of plants in our ecosystem. They'll learn how plants produce oxygen and provide food for many living things, reinforcing their understanding of why plants are so vital to life on Earth.
