Arizona Charter Schools Shine on Nation's Report Card

The National Assessment for Educational Progress, or Nation's Report Card, released scores recently that show charter school students in Arizona outshine their non-charter peers in **every grade** and **every subject** statewide. In fact, if the charter schools in Arizona were scored as their own state, they would rank **first in the nation** in eighth-grade math and **second** for eighth-grade reading.
