AIMS/Stanford 10 Testing

April 16 - April 20, 2012 is AIMS and Stanford 10 testing for grades 2-8. Please have your children to school on time every day, after eating a nutritious breakfast. It is also important for them to get a good night's rest and to understand the importance of these tests. State test results are important indicators of what students have learned and whether they are mastering state standards at each grade level. Students will have the opportunity to eat a nutritious snack mid-morning during testing. If you are able, you may send them to school with a nutritious snack (cheese, crackers, fresh fruits or vegetables, etc., no cookies or candy, please). We will begin testing at 8:30 a.m. and keep all the students in the classroom until 11:30 a.m. Once testing has begun, students will not be permitted to enter the class, so please have them here on time. If you need to schedule a doctor or dentist appointment, please schedule it in the afternoon. Your cooperation in these matters is greatly appreciated.




Spring Festival


Box Top & Labels Update


